Research

Dissertation Project *The Cultural Logic of Accountability: How Leadership Ideals Shape Punishment and Responsiveness.*

Investigates how culturally embedded leadership norms shape political accountability across countries. Constructs a Cultural Norm Index using classic philosophical texts and a cross-national Accountability Index, and empirically examines how expectations of leadership affect elite punishment, responsiveness, and governance outcomes.

Working Project *Performing Accountability: Electoral Systems and Emotional Display.* Examines how electoral institutions shape legislators' emotional expression as a visible form of political accountability. Using multimodal evidence from South Korea's mixed-member system, shows that stronger personal accountability induces more adversarial emotional performance in legislative debate.
